- Board members *do not* make team-specific decisions, or provide special exceptions for individual players or families





Umpire Program


- RGS runs a youth umpire program. These umpires are used for RGS games.
- Most are current/former players in league and might include girls on your teams.
- During games, only **one** representative may engage with the umpire.
- All team staff, parents, spectators, etc. are expected to treat umpires with respect and refrain from negative behaviors.



Getting Started: Core 4, Equipment, Uniforms, Practices and Games

Core 4 (Team Volunteers)

- Each team must have a minimum of 4 adults on their coaching staff – this is known as the *Core 4: Head Coach, Assistant Coach, Team Manager, Team Parent.*
 - The league covers the cost of registration for the Core 4.
 - A minimum of two members of the Core 4 must be female.
 - *Ask in email to team or at your first team meeting if you have open roles.*
- Roles and Responsibilities are outlined in league Operating Policy
- You are responsible to confirm your Core 4 to your Player Agent by February 23
- Teams may add additional team staff if desired but must cover the cost.
- Registration is available on the RGS website.
- Only badged individuals are allowed on the field and in the dugout.



Core 4 Requirements

All volunteers MUST:

- Complete Background Check, Concussion Protocol, SafeSport certification - RGS pays for the cost of the Core 4; additional volunteers are paid for by the team
- Uphold the league policies and procedures
- Follow Volunteer Contract and Code of Conduct

The Core 4 set the tone for the team and the families in our league. Creating an environment of support, growth, and development is one of the most important elements of what we do as a league.



Virtual Team “Binder”

Every team will have access to a virtual “binder” of resources

- Required league documentation
- Playing rules
- Team tips and tricks (dugout organization, etc.)

These are all supportive documents that can help onboard you and your Core 4, players, and their families.

Team Communications

Every team will have site on TeamSideline. This will include

Team Equipment

Every team will be provided a division appropriate set of equipment and gear to use for the season. An itemized list of equipment is signed for by the manager or coach.

- Equipment Bag
- Catchers Gear
- Tee (for T-Ball and 6u divisions only)
- Bucket & 24 practice balls
- 1 equipment key
- Game Balls (issued before games start)




Additional equipment may be available upon request and may be checked out from our league's Equipment Manager.

Player Equipment

While the League does provide some basic equipment for team use, some equipment must be provided by parents:

- **Glove** (required): size depends on division and player preference.
- **Cleats** (recommended): rubber cleats or tennis shoes must be worn. Metal cleats are allowed in 14u and 16u divisions only.
- **Helmet** (required): must have NOCSAE symbol and include a face mask as required by USA Softball.
- **Bat**: All bats must have the USA Softball certification stamp to be approved for play.



Uniforms

League-Issued Uniform

- Each team is issued a set of game jerseys
- These items are the property of the player and are kept at the end of the season.
- Uniform pickup will be scheduled for early March – only a member of the Core 4 can pick up uniforms; they will not be released to parents individually.

Parent-Provided Uniform

In addition to the League issued jersey, additional uniform items must be provided by the parents:

- Softball pants (Black)
- Socks (decided on by team)
- League Visor (optional): May be purchased through the league at time of registration



Teams may decide on additional items (e.g. sweatshirts) at their discretion.

Season Kickoff – Team Meeting

Coaches can begin holding team meetings the week of February 3rd. These meetings are a good opportunity for the players and families to meet, for you to share your coaching philosophy etc. as well as to confirm information needed by the league:

- Have the players select their team's name (submit via form by February 23)
- Confirm any needed members of the Core 4 (submit via form by February 23)
- Confirm any needed team supports (field prep, scorekeeping)
- Confirm a need for a team sponsor
- Review Code of Conduct and
- Review Operating Policy (Section V: The Spectators)
- Complete Player Emergency Cards

Practices

- Practice schedule will be located on the RGS website
 - Preseason: 1x weekday, 1x weekend practice.
 - In-Season: 1x weekday practice.
 - Additional practices can be added once ALL teams have had a chance to fill their allotted practice times.
- The league Scheduler maintains all practice and game field assignments.
- Fields are allocated by the City of Roseville and we have use agreements in place to use fields in season.
- Teams are not permitted to practice on non-RGS fields or fields allocated to another league.
- Practice times and locations must be scheduled with the league Scheduler.



Game Days

Games are scheduled by the league. All division schedules will be posted on the RGS website and in your Team Sideline account/team profile.

- T-Ball and 6u: Saturdays
- 8u: Mondays & Saturdays
- 10u: Thursdays & Saturdays
- 12u (interleague): Wednesdays & Saturdays
- 14/16u (interleague): Wednesdays & Saturdays



Game Day Tips

- Arrive early to warm up (60-75 minutes before game time)
- Field Prep / Breakdown:
 - Home Team sets up the field
 - Away team breaks down and cleans up the field
 - Tap parents for help with this. *As coaches, your focus is to support getting your players ready for the game.*
- Lineups: Lineup cards should be completed and provided to the other team before game time (10u & up).
- After the game, please check the dugout for trash or other items and LOCK up all of the equipment and boxes.



Scorekeeping (10u & up)

- All teams (10u and up) are required to have a designated scorekeeper for every game
- Scorekeeping is required because league standings are maintained in 10u and up
- The scorekeeper can be designated at the start of the season (ask a parent on your team to help)
- The league will provide a Scorekeeping Clinic as well as a hardcopy book



Note: Teams may use GameChanger to keep score, but it is not a required platform



Managing Expectations

- **Recreational Philosophy:** Our goal is to help every player learn, grow, and build confidence over the season.
- **Equitable Playing Time:** The league OP outlines the requirement for equitable play time for all players regardless of experience.
- **Parents:** Parents are encouraged to cheer for all players and help create a supportive environment. Coaching from the stands or negative comments (toward players, coaches, or umpires) can take away from the experience.
- **Communication:** Develop a plan for regular team updates and communications.
- **24 Hour Rule:** The league requires that families wait 24 hours and then reach out respectfully through the appropriate league or team communication channels to address issues.

What We Do Matters

- Supporting the players in our league is more than just teaching them to play a game
- RGS give girls a place to belong, learn how to handle pressure, build confidence through effort—not perfection—and develop social and emotional skills.
- Recreational sports, especially, create low-pressure environments where girls can grow, make mistakes, and feel supported.
- We're not just building athletes — we're helping raise healthier, more confident young women.



What We Do Matters

- Participation is linked with better overall well-being and psychological health for youth.
- Higher confidence and lower levels of depression (e.g., 17% vs ~29% in non-players in some findings).
- Lower symptoms of anxiety and depression in adolescents — especially when playing on a team
- Lower suicidal thoughts and attempts among teens overall
- Better cognitive performance and academic outcomes, including memory, attention, and processing skills
- Female athletes are more likely to stay engaged academically and graduate compared with their non-athlete peers
- Nearly half of women surveyed credit their leadership development to experiences they gained through sports participation

Core 4 (Team Volunteers)

- Teams may add additional team staff if desired but must cover the cost. Registration is available on the RGS website.
- Only badged individuals are allowed on the field and in the dugout.

Core 4/Volunteer Clearance

- New platforms but the same requirements.
- RGS will submit volunteer information to USA Softball. All volunteers will receive an email from USA Softball to complete background checks and SafeSport training.
- All members of the Core 4 *must* complete a ***Background Check, Concussion Protocol, and SafeSport*** training
- Note: Only those who were cleared by USA Softball in Fall 2025 will have their clearance carry over to Spring 2026.
- Uniforms ***will not be released*** until your Core 4 have completed all processes.



Coach Conduct

- Code of Conduct Review
 - Every parent & volunteer agreed to this during their registration.
 - Our league is comprised of 500+ players & 50+ youth umpires. Be a good example to all of them.
 - Think of what is best for the girls.
- 24 Hour Rule
- Coaches are responsible for team members & spectators; this includes a zero-tolerance, no alcohol/drug policy.

Injury & Incident Report

- Doctor's notes
- Injury through RGS versus somewhere else

Uniforms

- Each team is issued a set of jerseys to be distributed to the players on the team.
- Uniform pickup will be scheduled for early March – location TBD
- Only a member of the Core 4 can pick up uniforms; they will not be released to parents individually
- Core 4 must be cleared before uniforms will be released

Uniform pickup will include:

- Jerseys
- Visors (if ordered by individual player)
- Coach apparel
- Scorebooks (10u & up)

End of Season Awards

- **Sportsmanship** (All Divisions): This award is presented to one girl from EACH team in all divisions. *It is determined by the girls*, NOT the management or coaching staff.
- **Most Coachable** (T-Ball/6u/8u): This award is given to the most coachable player on all teams in the 6U and 8U divisions only. *It is determined by the coaching staff*.
- **Most Valuable Player** (10u/12u/14/16u): MVP's are selected through a *nomination process and voted on by Coaches and Managers in the respective division*.
- **Coach of the Year** (all divisions): *Anyone on the team can submit a nomination*. Nominations are voted on by a selection committee.
- **Kristy Reed** (1 player per division): The league presents an award to *one player from each division* every year who best demonstrates the spirit, attitude and love of the game exemplified by Kristy. *Coaches submit nominations* that are voted on by a selection committee.





RGS Umpire Program & Playing Rules Review

Youth Umpire Program

RGS has a nationally recognized program for developing and retaining umpires. We are currently in the process of training 50+ umpires for the upcoming year.

RGS provides umpires for all scheduled games, including 6u and T-Ball.

Please remember:

- Just as the players on your team are learning the game, so are the youth umpires.
- Many of our umpires also play in the league and are the daughters of those sitting around you today.



Umpire in Chief (UIC) Update

- The Core 4 must set the expectation and control their spectators regarding conduct.
- Only ONE identified staff member can communicate with the umpires during the game; this individual is to be identified during the plate meeting.
- Judgement vs. Rule Interpretation
- Be calm, cool, and collected.

UIC: Rules Review



Field Manager Update

Field Rejuvenation... What have we been working on?

- Dirt has been added to both Pistachio fields and we have fixed that nasty lip at Pistachio 1.
- Field conditioner has been added to Pistachio 1 to help with rain/water drainage
- Clay has been added to Central and Pistachio pitching lanes and batters boxes
- We've been working on getting the fields graded and leveled, but the poor weather has made it difficult to get this completed. This will be ongoing throughout the season.
- We will continue to work on fields throughout the season.



Want to help? We have a Field Committee starting this month!

Field Manager Update: Field Etiquette

- Take pride in the fields we are allocated.
- Treat the field equipment with respect. We've purchased new chain drags, more durable pitching rubbers, new rakes and two new green chalkers with a pitching circle attachment.
- 1st practice - drag field **before** practice.
- Last practice - drag field **after** practice.
- Lock equipment boxes at the end of day. **Make sure lock is pushed in.**
- Chalker, box templates, chain drags and pitching screen if applicable are chained to the dugout. Equipment lock combo is 5625.
- Bases are put away and base plugs are put in the base receiver.



Field Manager Update: Field Prep

- **HOME TEAM is responsible for setting up/chalking the field.** Home teams also freshen up chalk lines IF needed.
- **AWAY TEAM is responsible for breaking down/dragging fields at the end of game day.** Double check to make sure all equipment is where it should be at the end of game day.
- **EMPTY ALL CHALKERS** of all chalk into the orange buckets after the final game for the day.
- We have a small handheld toolbox that has all the small tools to prep fields. Make sure the tools return to the handheld toolbox after the field is prepped. Included is a measuring reel for the pitchers mound, string reel for setting fair foul line, hammer, nails and pitching mound nails. Put the handheld box into the storage box.
- **We've updated the field prep video so please go check it out. Watch the Youtube Video created by RGS. Search Roseville Girls Softball**
- Please be respectful of the equipment. We all have to use it. If something is broken or missing, please email: fieldmanager@rosevillegirlssoftball.org so we can get it replaced.
- Field prep clinic coming soon. Information will go out in the next couple weeks.

Field Manager Update: Inclement Weather Policy

Field conditions/closures are updated by the City of Roseville at 3pm. The league will work to ensure notifications go out as soon as we know.

Reinspect Conditions

Infields are **closed** when:

- Standing/puddles of water
- Your feet are slipping as you walk the infield
- The depth of your footprint is greater than 1 inch

Outfields are **closed** when:

- Standing water in the grass
- The depth of your footprint is greater than 2 inches
- Your footprints are filling with water after you take a step



Scheduler Update

- Practice schedule will be located online (RGS website)
 - Preseason: 1x weekday, 1x weekend practice.
 - In-Season: 1x weekday practice.
 - Additional practices can be added once ALL teams have had a chance to fill their allotted practice times.
- Once we get final field allocations, we will assign practices by request in a random team order.
- Practice times are for dirt/infield. You can arrive early to warm-up in grass but you will need to stay out of the way of scheduled team.
- There may be times the scheduler has to move your practice or you will be asked to share with another team. Be flexible.
- Teams may not hold practices on fields or areas that are not allocated to RGS. This jeopardizes our allocations and our insurance. This is also violation of Code of Conduct.

Sponsorship Update

Sponsorships help keep league costs down and are a great way for local businesses to partner with league!

- All teams are required to have a sponsor.
- We recommend asking if there are any families that are interested in sponsorship during the first team meeting.
- We offer several sponsorship levels that include various benefits such as names on team jerseys, team plaques, banners at Central and/or Pistachio, social media posts, etc.
